- OHT Update** – May 15th was the deadline to submit an initial Ontario Health Team (OHT) Readiness Assessment. The number of applications received surpassed expectations, so invitations for business cases will be issued in early July. Multiple proposals were submitted from within the Mississauga Halton area, with much interest expressed by Primary Care. The Primary Care Network will continue to update as often as possible. The Mississauga Halton LHIN is facilitating an info session for primary care physicians on Thursday, June 13th. See attached for registration details.

- FIT Testing** – Ontario will be transitioning to the Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT) on June 24th. Cancer Care Ontario will be mailing out sample FIT kits and supporting materials to primary care providers. The process for ordering kits will change and kits will be mailed directly to patients. - Orthopedic Referrals** – Dr. Thomas Zochowski is a new Hip/Knee Arthroplasty surgeon at Oakville Trafalgar Memorial Hospital who is encouraging referrals for hip/knee osteoarthritis to go through the Mississauga Halton Central Intake Rapid Access Clinics. The Hip and Knee Central Intake and Rapid Access Clinic program provides patients with moderate to severe hip and knee arthritis assessment within 4 weeks of the referral. Patients receive a comprehensive assessment, education and recommendations based on their needs including a referral for surgical consult and non-surgical management. 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Dear Primary Care Colleagues,

Preliminary applications for Ontario Health Teams (OHTs) were submitted on May 15, 2019. Physicians have many questions regarding OHTs. In response to questions raised by physicians at the last meeting, the LHIN has invited experts on integrated care to support primary care in understanding:

- how these system work in other jurisdictions,
- what integrated care could mean for primary care physicians, and
- how integrated care systems could impact patients.

Now is the time for primary care physicians to organize to ensure their voices are heard as these teams evolve. Primary care needs to be accessible so those planning can work with the sector. Many of the physicians in Milton have come together to collaborate on the OHT concept. By working together like this as a sector, primary care can be more effective in ensuring the development of these teams meet your needs and those of your patients.

The agenda for the evening will include a panel presentation from the following speakers, followed by a Q&A period and opportunity for networking with colleagues to discuss how primary care can organize as a sector.

Dr. Robert Reid – As a researcher from the Institute for Better Health, Dr. Reid will share the theory behind integrated care systems and share models from around the world and their results they have achieved in terms of patient outcomes.

Dr. Dean Roehl – A primary care physician, who previously worked at Group Health in Seattle and now works in our Ontario context in a Community Health Centre, will share his experience of what it is like to work in one of these models – the benefits and the drawbacks – and how it is different from practice in Ontario.

Dr. Mira Backo-Shannon – A local Oakville physician, who also provides clinical leadership at the LHIN, will share insights from her recent trip to the National Health System in England. She will discuss the grassroots approach she observed primary care using to create solutions in their communities.
