What's Happening in Primary Care?

As part of Ontario's Patients First Act, the province aims to provide better health care through:

- 1. the creation of care communities to better understand local needs
- 2. greater collaboration both within the primary care sector, and across the whole care continuum
- 3. interprofessional primary care team expansion, where necessary

The Mississauga Halton LHIN's Sub-Region Clinical Leads have been connecting with colleagues in their respective areas over the past few months garnering feedback to bring back to the provincial planning tables. The feedback is being used to inform planning of new interprofessional health care hubs and build the optimal model of primary care delivery in Ontario.
